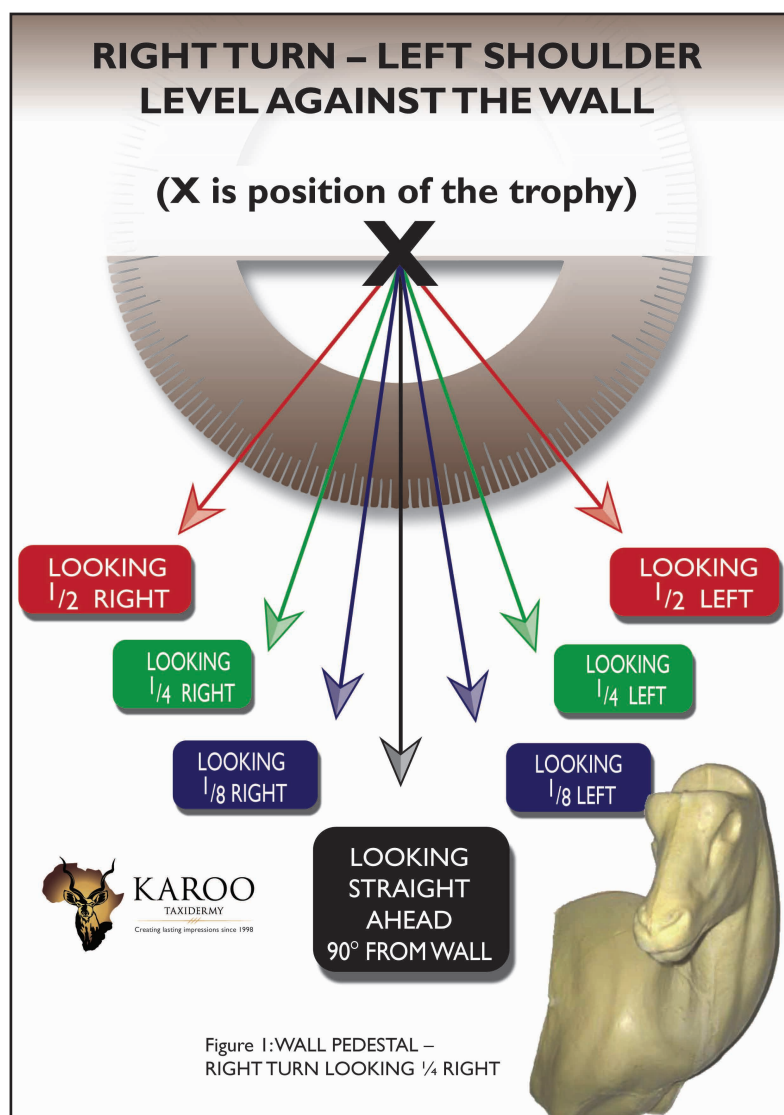
INSTRUCTIONS FOR WALL PEDESTAL MOUNTS EXPLAINED

***Wall pedestals can either be a right turn or a left turn.**

***There are different directions within the right and left turns.**

WALL PEDESTAL – RIGHT TURN

- A **right turn looking straight** put simply means that the left shoulder of the animal is against the wall and the animal is looking straight out from the wall (90° turn). Therefore, if you were to stand directly in front of the animal it would be looking straight at you.
- $\frac{1}{8}$ turn to the right: If you were to stand directly in front of a wall pedestal trophy that is a $\frac{1}{8}$ turn to the right, the animal would then be looking over your left shoulder; its head turned very slightly away from the center (as if the animal might want to 'look behind' itself).
- $\frac{1}{4}$ turn to the right: If you were to stand directly in front of a wall pedestal trophy that is a $\frac{1}{4}$ turn to the right, the animal would then be looking over your left shoulder; its head turned slightly away from the center, but a more pronounced turn (as if the animal might want to 'look behind' itself).
- $\frac{1}{2}$ turn to the right: If you were to stand directly in front of a wall pedestal trophy that is a $\frac{1}{2}$ turn to the right, the animal would then be looking over your left shoulder; its head turned quite extremely away from the center (as if the animal might want to 'look behind' itself).
- $\frac{1}{8}$ turn to the left: If you were to stand directly in front of a wall pedestal trophy that is a $\frac{1}{8}$ turn to the left, the animal would then be looking over your right shoulder; its head turned very slightly away from the center (as if the animal might want to look ahead).
- $\frac{1}{4}$ turn to the left: If you were to stand directly in front of a wall pedestal trophy that is a $\frac{1}{4}$ turn to the left, the animal would then be looking over your right shoulder; its head turned slightly away from the center, but a more pronounced turn (as if the animal might want to look ahead).
- $\frac{1}{2}$ turn to the left: If you were to stand directly in front of a wall pedestal trophy that is a $\frac{1}{2}$ turn to the left, the animal would then be looking over your right shoulder; its head turned quite extremely away from the center (as if the animal might want to look ahead).

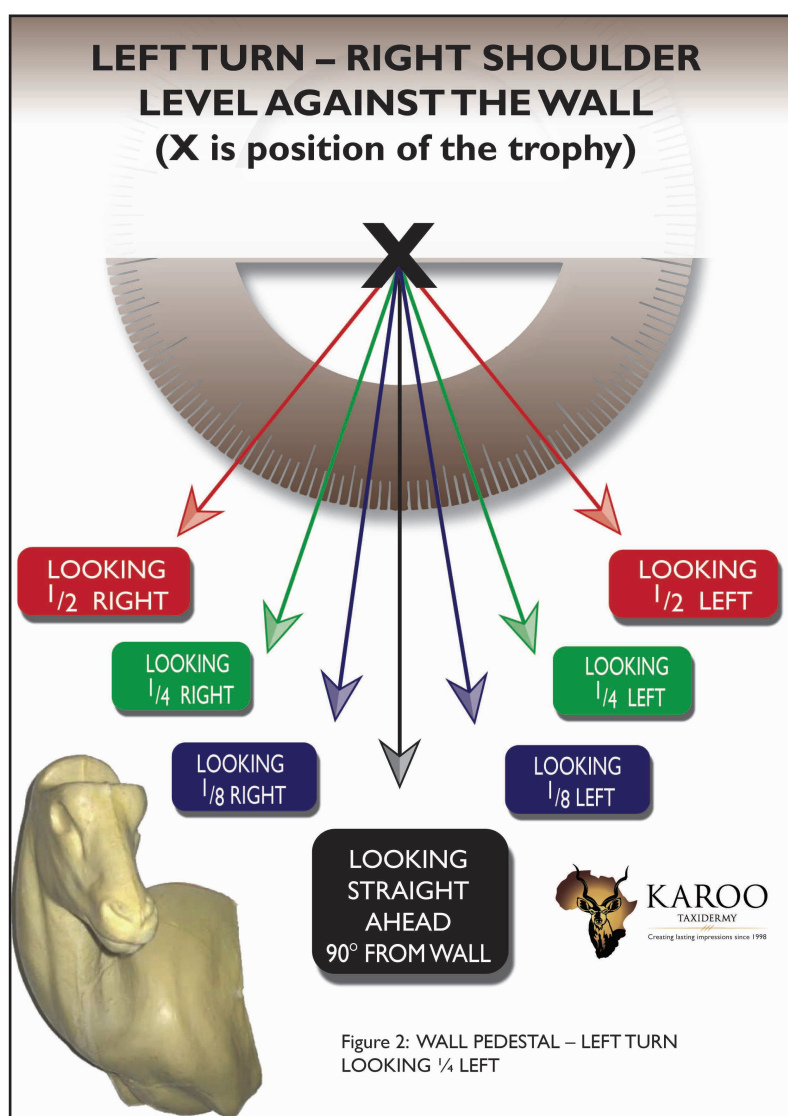

WALL PEDESTAL – LEFT TURN

- A left turn looking straight put simply means that the right shoulder of the animal is against the wall and the animal is looking straight out from the wall (90° turn) Therefore, if you were to stand directly in front of the animal it would be looking straight at you.
